**Introduction:** sin or suffer

1. Prepared to suffer rather than sin (v16-18)
  - Defiance
  - Remain respectful
  - Correct fear of the Lord (note: Acts 5:28ff)
2. The suffering looks especially nasty (v19-23)
  - Deeply personal
  - Plot twist
3. The Lord remained with them (v24-26)

Conclusion: The Lord will always deliver his people (v27-30):

Note: Luke 12:1-5

How does this passage help us to 'suffer' and not 'sin'?
