The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority, but the Father who dwells in me does his works. 11 Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else believe on account of the works themselves.

Introduction

Have young men lost their 'herd immunity' to Christianity?

1. God has made himself known generally in creation

Psalm 19:1-2 'The heavens declare the glory of God and the sky above proclaims his handiwork, day to day pours out speech and night to night reveals knowledge.'

Romans 1:19- 20 'what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely his eternal power and divine nature have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made.'
