## Introduction

- Belief in Jesus is uncommon but worth it
  - Setting the scene (v22-23)
1. The people challenge Jesus' identity (v24)
  2. Jesus responds and points out their.... (v25-29)
    - ...failure to believe the evidence (v25)
    - ...fragile existence going forward (v26-28a)
    - ...futile attempts to hurt Christians (v28b-29)
  3. Jesus states his identity: *I and the Father are one* (v30)

## Implications

- I. Unbelief validates Jesus' claims (cf 5:21-22; 9:39)
- II. Expect unbelief and worse (!)
- III. Be assured that belief is worth it
